

## Recruiting study sites for IRB studies:

## 1. Microcurrent for Reducing Pain and size related to chronic wounds

Purpose of the studies: US IRB study using microcurrent therapy for

- Pain relief for reducing opioid use
- Pain relief for covered open wounds
- Reducing wound size in chronic wounds

This is a validation study modeled after the 100-patient case series in Malaysia which was a joint effort where the

- Hospital provided facilities, patients with chronic wounds, standard of care therapy and staff to provide Avazzia microcurrent.
- Avazzia provided devices, paid a nurse to train hospital staff, patient training, document control
- Therapy applied before dressing removal and changes to dressings and also applied at home by participants.
- The hospital or hospital staff was not paid by Avazzia

Result was cost-effective study in a premier government hospital.

Malaysia 100-patient case series was presented at the North Borneo Wound Conference, Magellan Sutera Harbour, Kota Kinabalu, Sabah, 20 August, 2016 by Dr. Harikrishna K.R. Nair SIS KMN, MD, OSH, OHD, CMIA, Wound Care Unit, Department of Internal Medicine, Kuala Lumpur Hospital.
